Minutes of a Parish Council Meeting Held on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> September 2023 at 7.30pm In the Village Hall

### 23/61. To receive apologies for absence

Cllr Doyle (personal) and Cllr Wilson-Medhurst (personal)

# 23/62. To receive Declarations of Interest under the Council's Code of Conduct relating to business on the agenda

No interests were declared.

### 23/63. Election of Vice-Chair

It was proposed by Cllr Smith and seconded by Cllr Rapp that Cllr Lucks be Vice-Chair.

### 23/64. To approve the minutes of the meeting held on 18th July 2023

The minutes were approved and signed as a true record.

### 23/65. To note any matters arising from the minutes not included on this agenda

There were no matters arising.

## 23/66. To receive reports from the County Councillor and District Councillor

County Cllr George Reynolds noted that the OCC coalition has broken up. OCC are now being led by the Liberal and Green parties. The Banbury Cycling and Walking plan has been approved.

A written report had been received from District Councillor Andrew McHugh and circulated. The main points included: Ardley and the Dinosaur (visit by Cllr McHugh to Ardley Energy from Waste facility) and review of the Local Plan. Cherwell will provide 25,860 homes from 2020 to 2040. 500 houses are proposed for rural areas.

### 23/67. To receive an update on the 20mph scheme

The 20mph scheme has been approved by OCC.

### 23/68. To receive an update on the damaged white gate and damaged chevrons

The white gate at the Chipping Norton end was damaged by a car earlier in the year. The incident was not reported to the police. Cllr Rapp asked the insurance company if the PC could claim for the repair. It has finally been agreed they will pay the claim and a payment of £600.00 has been received from Zurich Insurance.

Action: The Parish Clerk to action the repair.

### 23/69. To receive an update on the Fourth Field

OCC had asked if their own form could be filled in. It was agreed that the Parish Clerk contact all the people who replied in 2021. Another email was sent out but only a few responses received back. It was agreed to try one final time.

Action: The Parish Clerk to send another email.

#### 23/70. To discuss the Cherwell Local Plan Review 2040 consultation

The six week consultation began on 22<sup>nd</sup> September and will run until 3<sup>rd</sup> November. 500 houses are proposed for rural villages. South Newington is classed as a small village and infill only. Neighbourhood Plans were discussed and whether they are of benefit to a small village. They are more suited to larger villages.

## 23/71. To discuss the Playground Inspection report

The Poleaxe was inspected in July and the report circulated to Councillors. There are two areas that require the clearing of moss. The swing seats are damaged and require monitoring. There are two tripping points under the multi play unit and junior swing which require attention.

Action: The Parish Clerk to ask Nigel Prickett to remove the moss. The Parish Clerk to ask Kompan to quote to repair the tripping points.

# 23/72. To receive an update on the Traffic Plan Enforcement and issues around the building work at The Little Forge

Concerns were raised regarding deliveries being made, not adhering to the Construction Management Plan and other examples of non compliance. A letter was sent to CDC Enforcement but no reply received. Cllr A McHugh agreed to take the matter up with CDC.

Action: The Parish Clerk to forward the letter to him.

### 23/73. To receive an update on the Christmas tree

A permanent tree measuring 1.75m to 2m has been ordered.
