South Newington Domestic Heating Oil Group

Did you know that South Newington has a syndicate for ordering domestic heating oil? Once a month, a consolidated order is placed with a supplier that offers the best price. By ordering in bulk, a better price per litre can be obtained than by ordering single deliveries. To request an oil delivery you simply fill in an electronic form and then in two to three weeks your oil will be delivered. To keep the system simple, paying for the oil is down to the individual resident who places the request.

The Poleaxe

A recreational area with children's play apparatus at the lower end of the High St/Green Lane. For safety, children should be supervised and users are asked to respect the privacy of neighbouring residents. Dogs are not allowed on the Poleaxe.

Parish Noticeboard

Sited to the right of the church gate, it has an open access portion for residents use and an area for display of Parish Council Agenda, Minutes etc. Items are also posted on the website.

Bonfire Site

There is a bonfire site in the lower part of Moor Lane for the burning of Garden Waste only and should not be used for DIY waste. Additionally, please burn your waste after dumping it there rather than relying on others in the village to do so. It is a community 'facility', and all users should play their part in maintaining it. Please ensure the safety of your bonfire, use the site responsibly, and ensure it is left in a tidy state after your bonfire is extinguished. Food waste is now permitted.

Salt Bins

We have 5 salt bins that are distributed around the Village; These are communal bins so please use only what you need; it is most effective when spread sparingly. The Bins are filled late December, and again late Summer. It is not possible to place additional orders if supply is low.

Quiet Sundays

Village residents are respectfully asked where possible to avoid the use of loud machinery, (chainsaws, motor driven mowers/strimmers etc.) after 1300* on Sundays to allow all village residents to enjoy a quiet period in the afternoon.

Footpaths and Bridleways

Numerous paths/bridleways surround the village and are shown on the Oxfordshire Footpath map sheet SP43.

Note: that the last major update was in 2006 so more recent diversions or closures are not shown. Ordnance survey maps also show local paths & bridleways.

Conservation Area

Many houses within the village fall within a designated Conservation Area. A map is provided below. Alterations or additions to buildings, erection of new buildings or sheds/greenhouses, major tree or hedge pruning etc. will generally require Planning Permission from Cherwell District Council. Please check with the Cherwell Planning department before undertaking any 'works', to avoid any problems. New planning applications can be viewed on the Cherwell website www.cherwell.gov.uk.

49 Club

The village operate a 49 Club (£1 per week subscription) which pays out £35 on the first week of the month and £20 on other weeks to the holder of the bonus ball number from that week's National Lottery. Annual South Newington Flower and Produce Show

One Saturday each August; The Poleaxe becomes home to a traditional marquee full of exhibits for the annual show, with a local band, traditional teas, grand raffle as well as lots of stalls. The schedule for the show is circulated to all villagers around April.

Schedules and fliers are distributed around the village and the date is in the Newsletter and on the website.

Dog Owners

Please be a responsible dog owner and help reduce dog fouling problems in the lanes and paths in and around the village. There are dog bins sited within the village which are emptied by Cherwell District Council or please bag it and take it home with you for disposal in your green bin.
